Chief People
Jesus - he physically existed John – he witnessed Jesus' physical existence False Teachers – not explicitly mentioned, but they are implied
Choice Verse
1 John 1:5b “God is light; in him there is no darkness at all.”
Crucial Words
Physical descriptors (heard, seen, touched, appeared) – John was combating a theology that taught Jesus had only come in the spirit (i.e., he had no physical body). John uses these words to reiterate the physicalness of Jesus. Light and Darkness – Light and Darkness are used as metaphors for truth and lies.
Challenges <i>(Difficulties I need to study)</i>
What does “fellowship” really entail? How do I really know if I have “fellowship” with the Father and his Son?

Seen with our eyes

- Luke 1:2 – Luke gets his account from eyewitnesses
- John 1:14 – we beheld his glory
- 2 Peter 1:16 – Others were eyewitnesses
- Luke 24:39 – Jesus was physically touched to confirm he had flesh and bones

Light and Darkness

- James 1:17 – Father of lights
- Psalm 119:105 – The “truth” of God’s word is a light to my path
- Psalm 19:8 – The commands of the lord give light to the eyes
- Psalm 27:1 – The Lord is my light and my salvation
- Psalm 43:3 – Send forth your light and your truth
