1) Why was he chosen to be a leader?

Because he was full of the Holy Spirit and wisdom (Acts 6:3)

Because he was full of Faith and the Spirit (Acts 6:5)

Because he was full of God's grace and power (Acts 6:8)

Because he knew the Scriptures (Acts 7:2-53)

2) How did he handle false accusations?

He "kept his cool," remained silent, and only answered when he was directed to speak by the high priest.

3) Are there any parallels with Jesus?

Yes. Just like Jesus, he was falsely accused, demonstrated love and concern for his accusers and died an "undeserved" death.

4) What was his attitude toward his executioners?

He was forgiving, even to the point of praying that God would forgive them for their sin.

5) What were the long-term results of his life, ministry and death?

His death caused the disciples to scatter and take the Gospel to other parts of Judea, Samaria, and regions beyond Israel in fulfillment of Acts 1:8.

His death sets a path by which Saul is brought to the Lord.
